- Held a Wakefield MAG Bike Show at the May Day Gala (first time in 2 years due to Covid lockdown restrictions). Bike show was popular (40 odd bikes), the tombola was particularly successful pulling in £134.17 and product sales raised a further £7.50. Not bad for a days work.
- Members attended and marshalled the Into the Valley Rally at the new Driffield Showground venue
- Held an Easter Egg Collection in aid of Wakefield based Charity Kidzaware
- Held Social events on the last Tuesday of the month with various activities including quizzes, pool and darts competitions

- Assisted Wakefield Hospice with Marshalling their 10K Race in March
- Held the 17th Post Christmas Auction in January which raised £339, which we rounded up with £7 from branch funds so MAG received £226 (2/3 of the proceeds) and the remaining 1/3 (£120), was split equally between Yorkshire Air Ambulance and NABD

- N.B. Membership retention figures no longer available
- Meeting attendance has slowly increased since covid lockdown restrictions were lifted but despite getting a few new members attending meetings over the year, with the exception of one, none have returned after their first meeting (something to look at in 2023)
- 10 Monthly newsletters produced (2 of which both covered 2 consecutive months) covering local, regional and national news & updates (published on the website and plugged on Facebook too (website stats show these are widely read)
- Annual mailshot letter sent in December to advertise AGM and plug membership renewal

- Website regularly maintained with current content & event reports for all of the events and activities we get involved with. Site is regularly looked at (53,539 hits since visitor stats first maintained in July 2008). Site gets a lot of praise at the NC and is held up as a model MAG Branch web site
- Facebook site maintained with current content & currently 546 members of the Wakefield MAG Facebook Group (498 members last year) – Facebook converted site to a Public group in November 2021 so people no longer need to apply to join the group (unfortunately, members / contributors are not all MAG members)

#### **SUMMARY**

We now celebrate 21 consecutive years as an active MAG Branch and 20 consecutive years with me as Branch Rep!!!!!

In those 21 years, we haven't had to reform / re-launch to keep going. WF postcode Membership numbers at 85 are the average over the last 15 years. Meeting attendance isn't quite back at the pre-pandemic levels but we get greater than the MAG national average at our meetings (10% meeting attendance of the membership in a groups catchment area is considered excellent). We have lost some active and long standing members over the past couple of years which we really need to replace with new blood – something to focus on in 2023.

This year has pretty much been back to normal and we have run our full set of events and absolutely smashed our fund raising target for the MAG fighting fund. We are a small branch, but it is fair to say, that in spite of our size, we really do punch well above our weight in terms of active members, activities we hold and the funds we raise for MAG.

I also have to personally thank Chas Milner, Deputy Rep and Champion Fundraiser, who is retiring after 10 years service – you have served the branch exceptionally well and will be a hell of a tough act to follow.

In summary, another highly successful year for the branch. A huge thanks to all our meeting regulars and all those who have supported the branch in all our activities. Hip Hip .. Hooray.

## Finance Officer Report - Financial Report & Audited Accounts for 2022

We started 2022 with a healthy £670.50 in cash and £1,653.88 in our bank account. This was mainly due to not making a donation to Yorkshire MAG in 2021 as we'd still been up and down with the Covid pandemic.

At our 2022 AGM in January I was re-elected as the finance officer and we all agreed that a reasonable donation to Yorkshire MAG would be made during 2022.

We had a total income of £1,526.14 and a total spend of £345.27 throughout 2022 (full breakdown of this is detailed on the attached spreadsheet)

We decided in June to donate £2,500.00 to Yorkshire MAG and this was done around the time of the Yorkshire MAG AGM.

This leaves us with a closing balance for 2022 of £1,005.25 which is £52.05 in cash and £953.20 in our new Lloyds bank account.

## Significant events during 2022:

- Our previous bank HSBC had decided to charge £5 per month for the privilege of using their services so we decided to f\*\*\* them off and as an interim measure all account money was transferred into a "spare" account held by Steve Travis (probably got more Swiss bank accounts than a giant Toblerone has corners). This wasn't ideal and after a bit of hunting round for a new bank Steve found a Lloyds account which suited us. Lots of formalities to go though to set this up, but it's up and running now and with on-line banking is much easier to use.
- Our post Christmas auction in January raised £339.00 so good result there.
- Our bike show tombola raised £134.17 so hats off to the organisers (Pete, Carrie & Izzy) for their work with that.
- Bingo night was down a bit on previous event but still managed £73.20
- Cheers to Chas (official fundraiser) for the Christmas draw tickets which brought in £203.01. Also thanks to Pete Taplin for huge ticket sales.
- Chas's one to ninety draw brought in £120 (3 x £40) and saw Crazy John winning £50 on two occasions and Ash Dobson winning the third (still hasn't bought a round though).

• And finally our weekly number draw, which can still be won even if you not in attendance at the meeting raised a whopping £482.00 which works out as an average of £12.36 over the 39 weeks it was drawn.

Massive thanks to everyone who dug deep in 2022 and/or helped with various events and we start 2023 with another healthy balance and potentially in a good position to donate significantly to Yorkshire MAG later in the year.

Finally thanks to Pete Taplin and Terry Scott for auditing \* the figures and as finance officer for 2022 I'm more than willing to continue this role through 2023.

## **Political Officer**

The first thing I did as political officer was getting in touch with Tom Lonsdale the Yorkshire political officer. After an initial call, I got more of an understanding of what the role of political officer involved ... a lot of emailing to MP's. After this initial call I created a national MAG political group chat on Whatsapp, the current members include political officers from across the country.

The first email I sent to the Wakefield MP was on the Anti-tampering legislation the government want to introduce to stop motorcyclists modifying their motorbikes. Unfortunately, I didn't receive a reply but I think that has a lot to do with the Imran Khan scandal. The petition for the anti-tampering legislation received 112,000 signatures and a parliamentary debate took place. I am glad to say the governments "intention is to ensure that we maintain a thriving aftermarket including motorsports, restoration, repairs and other legitimate improvements and alterations to vehicles.", I consider this a big win for motorcyclists and would like to thank mag members who signed the petition. I also emailed Louise Haigh the Shadow Secretary of State for Transport of the United Kingdom, outlining the issue that motorcycles do not get mentioned in Labours Transport plan of a general election manifesto. This is a great shame as 10% of driving license holders have a motorcycle category on their licence. Unfortunately, again no reply. We did get a reply from Mark Jenkinson MP on MAG's four point plan to support motorcycling, with Mark ending the email by saying he is looking forward to further constructive engagement from MAG.

I think the Wakefield political environment in 2022 has been turbulent, however I think 2023 brings the opportunity to consult more with Simon Lightwood our newest MP, Simon is also the shadow minister for Transport. During 2022 I also set up a Wakefield MAG Instagram account which has gained 395 followers to debate, I currently post photos of motorbikes and information about MAG rallies, I think the account can also be used in 2023 to raise awareness of political issues facing the motorcyclists. Finally, I would like to wish everyone at Wakefield MAG a happy new year.

This is a shame as there are still a few members who would probably still like to do the occasional ride-out when time and other commitments allow and I hope that by me stepping aside someone else will step forward into the role and hopefully inject new impetus which may attract new interest, as maybe it's my ride-outs that people don't like, as I must admit they were aimed more at the experienced rider and a little off the beaten track which may have been a little daunting for some who prefer an easier less challenging ride.

Going forward I intend to engage in ride-outs organised by other clubs of which I am a member as their average attendance is considerably higher and means I will not have to do any of the organising. There is no reason why any of you should not attend if you so wish as you would be most welcome to tag along.

Also I am in two minds about whether or not to keep the Ride-out WhatsApp group up and running as I am the current administrator but if someone else steps forward as Ride-out co-ordinator then it should really pass on to them. Alternatively anyone can post on there that they are going for a ride somewhere at the weekend and does anyone want to tag along. This wouldn't be an official ride-out as such but just a social ride with a few friends.

I would like to finish by thanking all those who have attended my ride-outs not just last year but over all the years I have been involved in organising them it has been a pleasure to be in your company.
